Champagne

Even though effervescent wines abound throughout the world, true champagne comes only from France's northernmost wine-growing area, the Champagne region, just 90 miles northeast of Paris. Prestige Cuvée Champagnes are champagnes that are made from the first pressings of grapes and are usually aged longer in the bottles. A vintage champagne is declared by the house winemaker individually when they feel the year was great. A non vintage champagne can be a blend of different years.

FRANCE

BORDEAUX

The reputation of Bordeaux for producing some of the highest quality wines in the world originated with the English in the 1100's, whose royal cellars consumed, and paid handsomely for, up to 80% of the annual export from this region. This in turn established a base of powerful and wealthy familial dynasties that live on to this day. The unique geology, soil and landscape, crossed by the 45th parallel, results in a superb grape-growing environment, albeit inconsistent due to its proximity to the ocean. In accordance with the Institute of Appellations, Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Cabernet Franc, Malbec and Petit Verdot are the only grape varieties that may be used.

Médoc

Literally "The country in the middle", the Médoc is almost an island due to its geography between the ocean and the Gironde estuary. The organization of "Cru Classé" of 1st growth up to 5th growth was established following a decree by Napoleon III in 1855 of 61 Châteaux in the Médoc area. The classification stayed this way until 1973 when Château Mouton-Rothschild was finally ranked among the 1st growths. These wines are generally robust.

BURGUNDY

Well known for a diverse spectrum of wines composed of primarily Pinot Noir, Chardonnay or Gamay grapes, the great red wines of Burgundy use only the difficult Pinot Noir grape - called the heartbreak grape because of its fragile disposition. Situated in the eastern part of France, the vineyards of the Bourgogne can be found in four departments or counties. Within these counties there are six regions starting with Chablis in the north reaching down to Beaujolais in the south, crossing through the Côte de Nuit, the Côte de Beaune, the Côte Chalonnaise and the Maconnais. The classifications are "Grand Cru" (32), "1er Cru"(356), Appellation Villages, and Appellation Regionales. Beaujolais, Macon and Bourgogne Passe-tout-grain wines use only the Gamay grape.

PROVENCE & LANGUEDOC ROUSSILLON & OTHERS

Provence is the largest wine region in France. Bordering the Mediterranean, Languedoc-Roussillon area and Provence's arid climate produce the same grape varieties as can be found in the Rhone Valley. The wines have a rich deep color, powerful meaty flavors and may be kept for several years. These wines have to have a minimum of 50% of the Mourvedre grape variety for Provence region and 70% maximum of Carignan grape variety for Languedoc-Roussillon plus 18 months ageing, the rest is to the winemakers discretion.
